We are further planning to conduct more conferences in the departments by inviting resource persons from various prestigious Institutions.

#### **Best Practice – 2**

#### Title

Encouraging the staff and students to explore Digital Learning Resources

#### **Objective**

To educate the staff and students in exploring the digital learning resources.

#### Context

Implementing the usage of digital learning resources to the faculties and students for updating the knowledge in their field. This will definitely facilitates the improvement in the teaching-learning process.

#### The practice

MOOCS courses to cater to a larger group of students through the NPTEL and SWAYAM platform of MHRD are introduced. The students and faculty members are encouraged to register in the NPTEL (National Programme on Technology Enhanced Learning) online courses initiated by IITs and IISc. We have introduced the learning platform namely National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content (N-LIST) in the Institution. The N-LIST provides access to e-resources to students, researchers and faculty through servers installed at the INFLIBNET Centre.

#### Evidence of success

The e-resources provided by the providers are valuable for effectively developing the skills of the faculty and students and for improving the subject knowledge of them.

#### Problems encountered and resource required

More such courses related to digital learning will be introduced in the Institution for enhancing the digital learning process.
